FUND OBJECTIVE

The objective of the Flagship IP Worldwide Flexible Fund of Funds is to deliver long term capital growth by investing in a focused portfolio of stringently selected global equity fund managers. Investments, on a see-through basis, will be diversified across geographic regions, in both developed and emerging markets, and diversifies single manager and single style risk associated with investing through one asset manager only. The fund may invest across all asset classes, but, through the cycle, equity exposure will be maintained at around 80%, with the objective to outperform the MSCI World Index (in rands) over the long term (5 years). Our formal benchmark is CPI +5% and the fund is classified in the Worldwide - Multi Asset - Flexible sector.

FUND COMMENTARY ~ APRIL 2020

The fund performed better than both its benchmark (CPI +5%) and the MSCI ACWI for the month, despite being only 80% invested in what was a strong month for global markets. The fund has outperformed its benchmark, the JSE Allshare, and the average fund in the ASISA multi-asset flexible category over almost all time periods, including since inception.

The good performance in May was aided by returns of almost 10% for each of the Artisan Global Discovery and Sands Capital funds. As can be expected, the Fund's value-orientated funds continue to underperform its growth-orientated funds. From an asset allocation perspective, our equity exposure remains at the low end of our (self-mandated) 80% to 100% range, as we believe the disconnect between equity market performance and economic fundamentals makes markets vulnerable to a sell-off. We reduced our allocation to equities over the month by selling units in Artisan Global Value Fund, which has performed poorly, even when assessed against the sub-set of our value-orientated funds.

As required by legislation, we confirm that the fund has adhered to its policy objective and strategy.

MARKET COMMENTARY

International

In May, most markets firmed with a number of countries announcing measures to ease their lockdowns. In addition, many pharmaceutical companies also appear to be making progress with respect to a COVID vaccine.

The devastation wreaked by COVID on the global economy cannot be discounted, with information from many of the pandemic hotspots suggesting that the extent of the Covid-related devastation is disproportionate to the impact on world economies – with the mortality rate being far lower than originally thought due to the number of asymptomatic cases.

The already strained relationship between the US and China continued to deteriorate. This was not helped by the Chinese government passing a controversial security law for Hong Kong which its critics say curbs freedom of speech in the territory and allows the Chinese security agencies to set up offices there. In response, the US is threatening to withdraw Hong Kong's special trade status and the UK government has promised an easier route to British citizenship for applicable Hong Kong residents.

Finally, the death of an unarmed black man, George Floyd, who died of asphyxiation at the hands of a white police officer in Minneapolis, has resulted in widespread, mostly violent, protests in the US which have continued into June.

South Africa

During the month of May, South Africa concluded both Stage 4 and 5 lockdown stages with Stage 3 scheduled to begin on the 1st of June. Whilst many are keenly anticipating a return to some semblance of normality, the situation is looking precarious in the Western Cape where the number of infections continues to exceed those in the rest of the country by a substantial margin. May also saw a sharp strengthening of the rand, despite the government's muddled response to the COVID crisis, which we believe will act as a further setback to a recovery in the local economy.

Investment Policy

The Flagship IP Worldwide Flexible Fund of Funds is a Worldwide-Asset Allocation portfolio in the Flexible Portfolio Sector. The primary objective of the portfolio is to offer medium to long-term capital growth. The portfolio will invest in a range of participatory interests in equity, bond, money or property markets, in portfolios of collective investment schemes.

In order to achieve its objective, the investments normally to be included in the Flagship IP Worldwide Flexible Fund of Funds will, apart from assets in liquid form, consist of participatory interests of portfolios of collective investment schemes or other similar schemes, in equity, bond, money or property markets, registered in the Republic of South Africa, or of portfolios of collective investment schemes or other similar schemes or other similar schemes or other satisfaction of the Manager and the Trustee, and comply with the requirements of the Act and any regulations thereto.

TER and Transaction Costs

From 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2020 2.40% of the value of the fund was incurred as expenses relating to the administration of the fund. 0.56% of the value of the fund was incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the fund. Therefore, 2.96% of the value of the fund was incurred as costs relating to the investment of the fund. A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER may not necessarily be an accurate indication of future TER's. Transaction Costs are a necessary cost in administering the fund and impacts fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of fund, the investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Fund Risk Profile

The investment philosophy is medium to long term in nature but with a conservative bias. The use of several managers diversifies the single-manager and single-style risk associated with investing through one asset manager only. Asset allocation is adjusted according to changes in market conditions.
